# **Community Roadmap Review - Bay & Basin**

#### Thursday 9 June - The Country Club, St Georges Basin

Fourteen participants came together to review the community roadmap created as part of the Investing in Rural Community Futures (IRCF) Program. These organisations were represented: Sussex Inlet Chamber of Commerce, Sussex Inlet Neighbourhood Centre, Tomerong School of Arts, Vincentia High School P&C, Bay & Basin Community Resources, Uniting Church Husky Op-shop, Sanctuary Point Community Pride, Basin Villages Forum, Firefly, Shoalhaven Council, Sanctuary Point Community Champions and Vincentia Ratepayers and Residents Association. The workshop was hosted by Mel and Ronan from Campfire Coop, and Lauren and Deb from FRRR. Michael Robinson (Djiriba Waagura) welcomed us to Country.



# What brought you here today?

Here's a summary of responses to our check in:

### Revisit Vision and Principles

We revisited the Vision and Principles and made changes where it was felt necessary. The changes are reflected below (changes and additions in bold).

#### **Vision**

- Our organisations are connected, complementary and cooperative
- We are powerful advocates for our community
- We are shaped by the voices and aspirations of our community
- Our organisations are welcoming, inclusive and have opportunities for growth and development
- Young people have a place in our organisations and we are meeting their needs
- Young people have a voice in our communities and a place in our organisations and we work in partnership with them to meet their needs
- Our volunteer community is vibrant, active, and evolving
- Our organisations are adaptive, strategic, and sustainable
- All Bay & Basin organisations are a culturally safe space for a strong first nations voice

#### **Principles**

- We focus on building our relationships and collaborate where it makes sense to do so
- We welcome the contributions of newcomers and emerging leaders
- We value newcomers and emerging leaders of all ages as contributors in our communities
- We pay special attention to staying familiar and accessible, keeping our close connections with community
- We seek to apply local wisdom and creativity to local challenges and opportunities
- We seek allies and partners to best advocate for the big issues
- We take care to align people's passions and skills to unlock their potential
- We actively seek opportunities to listen to, learn from and work with Aboriginal communities and organisation

- Tomerong School of Arts: Newsletter and welcome pack for new residents





# Review and refine goals

We refined goals - updating wording, moving them, dropping some and adding new ones, and matched existing projects to each goal. A summary of the goals, in each IRCF Priority Area are provided below:

Access to project management support for new initiatives

Localised and customised policies and procedures

"Volunteering" Bay & Basin

Collective voice to advocate for Bay & Basin challenges and needs

Centralised facility asset and resource booking 'library'

A shared communication strategy for Bay & Basin organisations

Network of Bay & Basin organisations

P&Cs are working together

#### **Systems & Structure**

Current hardware & software that is well support, adaptable and user friendly

Vibrant, sustainable digital platforms for local organisation to connect to community



#### **Systems & Structure**

Access to reliable telecommunications and Internet (updated)

Efficient and affordable access to all compliance and governance expenses (Goal removed due to duplication)

Shared secretariat function for sustainability (goal removed)

#### **Investing in strategy**

Support to design sustainable social enterprises

External support to develop strategic plans and growth strategies + viability for organisations

Effective, clear and accessible communications and engagement strategies in place (updated)

Tools and strategies to engage well with youth (new goal)

Tools and strategies to engage well within organisation and community (Goal removed due to duplication)

Our organisations have Reconciliation Action Plans (RAPs) in place (Goal removed as it's included elsewhere)

- Request support from Council to develop survey to map skills and assets of community organisations
- Build a register of Community assets and skills (sector efficiencies)
- Community workshops on key issues
- Cultural awareness workshop
- Pooling local assets facilities and skills
- Community strategic plan and implementation
- Pilot PCYC outreach
- Project design and management for a stage design
- Onsultant to develop "Bay + Basin Beyond Barriers" Map-overlap-priorities
- Effective communications within B&B Community research and mapping
- Coordinating the intersection of IRCF projects with existing strategic plans and community consultation
- Program/strategy for work/life training for young people to keep them in the region
- Structure/mechanism in place for ongoing sharing of ideas and resources
- Communication strategists for all local organisations
