# **Program Information**



FRRR and the Vincent Fairfax Family Foundation (VFFF) have a shared belief in the critical role of not-for-profit (NFP) organisations in building and supporting vibrant communities, both socially and economically. So, it is essential that these critical organisations are resilient and able to support and respond to community needs.

The Investing in Rural Community Futures (IRCF) approach supports the abilities of NFP's to retain and invest in their organisation through their people, processes, and systems. To date IRCF has invested in long-term viability of individual organisations', and collaboration between NFPs who have identified common goals and needs in Junee, Leeton, and the Nambucca Valley.

Currently, FRRR is inviting applications for IRCF Partnership Grants to assist the community of **Leeton**.

Funds Available & Priorities Thanks to the generous support of VFFF, \$950,000 has been allocated to each community in IRCF Partnership Grants funding from 2019 to 2024.

#### Funds Available in this Final Round

Leeton: \$187,576

IRCF has taken a long-term approach to strengthening local NFP organisations, providing support over a five-year period, through community facilitators, grants, participatory planning processes, skills development, and evaluation.

With the conclusion of the program in June 2024, the program is now offering its final grants.

For this grant round, applications must **consider the needs of their local community and organisations beyond the IRCF program** and endeavour to embed skills, processes and networks that **collectively strengthen** these organisations.

Building on current momentum, this round of IRCF funding will prioritise **collaborative initiatives**. FRRR will be supporting Partnership grants that best align to the priority areas (see Appendix) and the community roadmaps.

Successful projects need to be acquitted by March 2024.

Types of Projects Supported In this final phase of IRCF Partnership grants, the program will prioritise the following types of activities:

### Revenue Diversification

- Training and the development of resources to support fundraising efforts, including ideas such as the development and maintenance of a community fund.
- Grant Assistance and Training.
- Activities that match purpose and strategy into ways of generating revenue for future sustainability.

#### Volunteer Engagement and Management

SWOT analysis for multiple organisations regarding volunteer engagement and management, towards developing a strategy that recognises current knowledge resources and required training to fill gaps.

### Strategy & Planning

Development of strategic and business plans through workshops with expert consultation for an extended period to build individual capacity and opportunities for collaboration with other organisations.

### **Facilitation Support**

- Engagement of personnel to support the brokerage of opportunities and ongoing skills development for the Local NFP sector.
- Facilitation support and training to aide collaborative planning processes.

### Marketing & Communications

Ommunication strategies and the development of processes, templates, and content to market, promote and advocate for the local NFP sector.

### Leadership

Leadership development, including methods of strengthening both informal and formal networks through mentoring or training opportunities.

### Succession Planning

Development of succession plans to develop practical ways of bringing others into organisations and minimising the practice of one person managing everything.

What grant funds can't be used for There are several areas that we cannot fund through this program. If in doubt, please contact us.

- Projects that support core business and areas of responsibility of Federal, State and Local Governments.
- The encouragement or advancement of sport, recreation and social activities that are not considered charitable activities under Australian law. Applications from sporting organisations need to clearly demonstrate charitable outcomes and benefit to the wider community that are above and beyond the sporting activities of the club.
- Overseas travel and overseas projects;
- Prizes, gifts, trophies or awards;
- Political lobbying;
- Projects that primarily benefit private business, a sole trader, or private interests;
- Projects solely focused on animal welfare.

PLEASE NOTE: Organisations that receive funding through the IRCF program are not eligible to apply for other FRRR grants for the duration of the program, except for recovery funds for natural disasters.

To apply, you must meet the following criteria:

- Applicant organisations must be a locally governed not-for-profit organisation in the Leeton LGA with an ABN or Incorporation Certificate;
- The project must be for charitable purposes and offer clear local benefit;
- Organisations with or without DGR endorsement are eligible;
- Projects must benefit communities in remote, rural, or regional Australia.
  Please note, you will be considered ineligible if the:
- Application is submitted by individuals, sole traders, private or commercial businesses (as per the submitted ABN);
- Application is submitted by an organisation that is not a legal entity (i.e. a registered not-for-profit), without the written consent of the governing / partnering body who holds the ABN / Incorporation Certificate;
- Applicant organisation does not have a bank account in the organisations name.
- Application is submitted without required financial documentation;
- Application is for a project or activity that has already occurred / is occurring prior to the announcement of funding.

If your project is eligible, a link to FRRR's online application portal Grants Gateway, will then be sent to you to begin your application by the Local Facilitator.
